

# College Board Advanced Placement Exam

Students at North Carolina Central University may receive placement in advanced courses and accelerate their studies through the College Board Advanced Placement Program and the International Baccalaureate Program. Advanced placement is available to students who score 3, 4, or 5 on the College Board's Advanced Placement Program tests. International Baccalaureate (IB) Higher Level Examination scores of 5, 6, or 7 will also secure advanced placement and college credit.

The following tables provide the details needed to match AP Examination scores with requisite course exemptions.

**5\*** With a score of 3, students are placed in MATH 2020 depending on curriculum. Upon completion of this course with a “C” or better on the first attempt, five hours credit will be awarded for MATH 2010. For a score of 4 or 5, five hours of credit will be given for MATH 2010 or three hours credit for 2000 depending on the curriculum.

**5\*\*** For a score of 3, there are two options. Option 1 - Five hours credit for MATH 2010 or three hours credit for MATH 2000 depending on the curriculum. Option 2 - Placement into MATH 2030. Upon completion of MATH 2030 with a grade of “C” or better, students will receive ten hours credit for MATH 2010 and MATH 2020.

**Note:** The English department faculty will not accept AP credit any longer for English 1300 and 1400 because they believe the AP Examination does not emphasize world literature prior to the 16th and 17th century comprehensively enough to give credit for these courses.
