RESEARCH IN PROGRESS

The Soccer Wars: Big Tobacco's Fight for the Latinx Market, 1975-1995 (tentative title)
This project, based off of my book chapter "Cup of Welcome?" explores the intersection of sport, migration, and marketing. It examines efforts by RJ Reynolds and Phillip Morris to use soccer as a way to increase market share in the Latinx community. From sponsorship of grassroots leagues to world-class events like the Camel Cup, these companies sought to use soccer to create "loyal" consumers. I envision this as a book-length project with opportunities for exhibits, both digital and in-person, of advertising material, internal company documents, and recordings of oral history interviews.
